## Scouts can earn Historic Trails Award at Pig Gig, Sept. 8-10

Most scouts have never seen the BSA Historic Trails Award, let alone earned it. Camp Tuscazoar is a historic camp, and lies in close proximity to the historic sites of nearby Zoar Village and Fort Laurens, and the Ohio and Erie Canalway trail. Give your scouts the chance to earn this unique award, while they learn more about their history, do some hiking, and contribute to one or more of these sites.

### Historic Trails Award Requirements

To earn the award, members of your unit must plan and participate in a historic activity. Members must:

1. Locate a historic trail or site and study information relating to it. (The information may be obtained from an adult historic society, public library, or people living near the trail or site.)
2. Hike or camp two days and one night along the trail or in the vicinity of the site.
3. Cooperate with an adult group such as a historic society to restore and mark all or part of this trail or site. (This may be done during the hike or overnight camp.) Or cooperate with such a group to plan and stage a historic pageant, ceremony, or other public event related to this trail or site—such an event should be large enough to merit coverage by the local press.

Your unit leader must then file the Historic Trails Award application with your local council service center.

## Bruce Winslow returns

At the 2016 Pig Roast we had a very welcome guest return to his roots at Camp Tuscazoar. I arrived early enough to meet him and talk with him. He has been active in scouting his whole life and traveled back here from Utah for a visit. Bruce wrote this list of his scouting accomplishments. Here they are:

### 50 Years An Eagle Scout

A tall skinny young man with eyeglasses carrying all his possessions in a Yucca Pack hiked into Turkey campsite at Camp Tuscazoar in 1962 for his first week-long camp out with Troop 1 of North Canton, Ohio.

"It seems like yesterday". That phrase is in my mind as I look back on the 50 years since I earned my Eagle rank in 1966. Now I am older with eyeglasses, but somewhat more filled out.

Camp Tuscazoar is prominent in my memories. I went to summer camp with Troop 1 from 1962 to 1966 and we were in Turkey campsite each year. In canvas wall tents on tent platforms. With squeaky metal cots. A latrine.

My memories are also of hiking around the hills to the many activities offered. Swimming in the pool on a hot and humid July day. Visitor's night and OA tap outs. Watermelon and skunks. Hills and rain and mud. Hiking to Pioneer Point with my rock. Hoping that I had tied the correct knot to get in the dining hall to eat. The wild and crazy songs and skits at meals and camp fires. The awesome Pipestone ceremonies.

And, of course, the toilet paper being shot out of the cannon at retreat. And earning my 5th year Pipestone and John Burroughs award. I was hooked on the outdoors.

I completed all the nature related merit badges and required ones for my Eagle. After receiving my Eagle I served as Nature Director in 1967 at Camp Tuscazoar.

you.*


